The *Society Order of the Sword and Spear* recognizes a member of the Society who has done outstanding work for their chapter, campus, community, and Society. The *Emerald and Pearl Award* recognizes outstanding contributions to the Alpha Delta Phi Society at the National level, and secondarily, exemplary contributions to the member's chapter. The *Star and Crescent Award* is awarded by the Society Board of Governors to a graduate member who has made an outstanding contribution to the Society; it is the highest distinction bestowed upon a graduate member of the Society.



Society Order of the Sword and Spear: Katy Thompson, MID 2015

As an undergrad, Katy served as an out-of-house chaplain as a junior and a critic her senior year at the Middletown Chapter. She helped impact Greek Life on campus by working closely with the Wesleyan administration to put together a new member policy. Emerald and Pearl Award: Max Morant, PENN 2016

Max graduated from the Penn Affiliate this year after being in the Phi for almost three years. Throughout his time as an undergrad, he served as President and Treasurer of his chapter, and was an Undergraduate Governor and Vice President of Undergraduate Parliament for the Society. As of this past convention, he's now the new Assistant Director of Development!





Star and Crescent Award: Chad Wolfsheimer, BRN 2000

Chad served as the fourth President of the Alpha Delta Phi Society, serving three years from March 2012 to March 2015. During his time as President, he oversaw the expansion of the Society at SUNY Plattsburgh, George Washington University, and Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute. He also nurtured a significant increase in the number of members who took an active role in national Society leadership. Leading our change from Conventions focused on presentations to ones focused on discussions, he empowered everyone to suggest and take on issues and projects important to them and their chapter or affiliate. Chad has also been an active

member of the Brunonian Chapter.
